

English

Writing to inform: English work is based on *The Wizard of Oz*. Children will be writing a narrative inspired by the story, focusing on descriptive language, dialogue, and character development. They will also create an information text, developing their ability to present facts clearly and effectively for a reader.

Reading: The Final Year – Matt Goodfellow

Grammar: children will continue to develop their use of a wide range of sentence structures, precise vocabulary, and punctuation for effect. They will focus on accurately using dialogue, relative clauses, adverbials, and cohesive devices to enhance their writing, alongside regular editing and proofreading.

Spelling: Year 6, 5, 4 and 3 national curriculum lists and high frequency words misspelled.

RE Thematic – what does it mean to

live a good life? help pupils to consider how different groups of people might answer this question, drawing on knowledge across different religions and beliefs

Games and PE

PE: Athletics. Track and Field events including long distance running, sprinting, relay, triple jump, shot put and javelin.

Rounders: batting, fielding, team tactics

Geography

Sustainability:

working in teams to design and build their own sustainable cities. Through this hands-on project, they'll explore key concepts such as renewable energy, green spaces, transport, and waste management, learning how cities can be designed to support both people and the planet.

how to build them and how components such as bulbs, buzzers, switches, and motors work. How voltage affects circuit performance and use symbols to draw circuit diagrams, developing their understanding of how electricity powers the world around us.
