Writing to Persuade: persuasive letter, persuasive speech, persuasive advert

Reading: Range of persuasive texts and extracts.

Grammar: Use a range of punctuation, so sentences are grammatically correct and avoid comma splicing (comma, dash, brackets, colon, semi-colon). Create complex sentences accurately by using subordinate clauses in varied positions. Uses relative clauses to give detail.
