Parental engagement with school, especially regarding attendance at information evenings and completion of homework

Pupil Premium expenditure

Teaching Assistant hours have been allocated across all year groups to provide additional support to Pupil Premium children with specific reading, writing and mathematical difficulties. Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium funding

Monitoring of attainment is used to inform pupil progress and identify specific support needs, in order to close the gap between disadvantaged children and their peers. The Senior Leadership Team regularly review the data and implement recommendations. The Governing Body oversees spending at each Finance Committee and Full Governing Body meeting.
